Invites You to Submit Abstracts for Consideration for our 2016 Wireless Technical Symposium

To be held on Friday November 18, 2016, at the New York Athletic Club in New York City

We seek interesting or important work in any of the following areas of wireless communications:

- Antennas, and supporting structures (towers, etc.)
- Broadband Communications
- Broadcast
- Cellular Communications Systems
- Ham (amateur) Radio
- Land Mobile Radio
- Military Communications
- Satellite
- Semiconductors or other devices supporting wireless communications
- Other Wireless Technologies of any kind

We welcome "early work", even if it's still in process. RCA offers a unique opportunity to get an early reaction to important work in wireless communications, prior to later publication in other technical journals and societies such as the IEEE.

Submit a 1-3 paragraph abstract by <u>June 13, 2016</u> (earlier submissions are encouraged). Include the title, author(s) and contact information; a short bio of the author(s); a synopsis of the work to be presented; and why you think the work is interesting or important to the wireless industry. Those that are selected will be given a ~45 minute presentation opportunity on November 18th, and your paper of any length will be made available on the RCA Website and at the event. (Note that participants will have to fund their own travel to the event in New York.) If you wish to perform a demonstration, we can accommodate that, but it must be within your allotted 45 minutes.

Last year we had 7 excellent presentations or panels on subjects like Tower Structural Health Monitoring, 5G vs WiFi, Using Radio Telescopes to Search for Extra Terrestrials, and Dynamic Spectrum Arbitrage. Companies such as Rivada and the SETI Institute presented, as well as a young high school student.
